Vision A world of living in harmony with nature by 2050



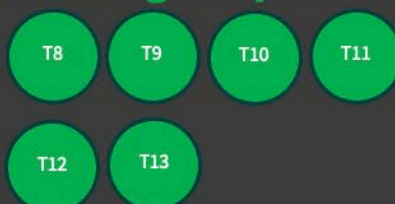
Mission To take urgent action to halt and reverse biodiversity loss to put nature on a path to recovery

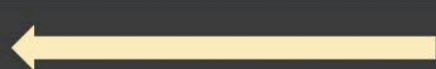

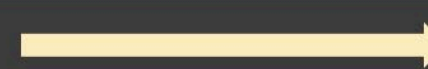

Four Global Goals for 2050

Goal A

- **Area of natural ecosystems** substantially increased
- **Integrity** of all ecosystems maintained, enhanced or restored
- **Extinction rate** and risk of all species are reduced tenfold
- **Abundance** of native wild species is increased
- **Genetic diversity** maintained

Goal B

- Biodiversity is **sustainably used** and managed
- **Nature's contributions to people** are valued, maintained, enhanced or restored

Goal C

- **Sharing of benefits** from genetic resources and digital sequence information substantially increased

Goal D

- Adequate means of implementation, **closing the biodiversity finance gap** of \$700 billion per year, and aligning financial flows



23 Targets for 2030: Examples

Target	
2	Restoration of 30% of terrestrial and marine ecosystems
3	Effective conservation and management of at least 30% of the world's land, coastal areas and oceans
11	Restore, maintain and enhance nature's contributions to people, including ecosystem functions and services (e.g., regulation of air, water and climate) through nature-based solutions and/or ecosystem-based approaches
18	Phasing out or reforming subsidies that harm biodiversity by at least \$500 billion per year , while scaling up positive incentives for biodiversity conservation and sustainable use
19	Mobilizing at least \$200 billion per year from public and private sources for biodiversity-related funding, including by raising international financial flows from developed to developing countries to at least US\$ 30 billion per year



Relationship with the SDGs

- The KM-GBF is a contribution to the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, with many targets in alignment with the 2030 Agenda
- Progress towards the SDGs will provide the enabling conditions to achieve the goals and targets of the KM-GBF

- National Targets
- National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plans (NBSAPs)
- Policies and actions on the ground



Support from the UN System

- GEF Early Action, GEF-8 Workprogramme, Global Biodiversity Framework Fund
- NBSAP Forum & NBSAP Accelerator
- Mobilization of Multilateral Development Banks
- UN Common Approach
- UN Country Teams to mainstream across ministries/sectors and to include in Sustainable Development Cooperation Frameworks (**whole-of-government** and **whole-of-society** approach)
- Biodiversity included in strategic plans of UN organizations
