Background

The Resident Coordinator’s Office (RCO) in Tajikistan has asked the United Nations Inter-Agency Issue-Based Coalition (IBC) on Environment and Climate Change for Europe and Central Asia to map examples and share good practice from other countries on how the UN identified key drivers of change and helped develop an integrated approach in green transformation that mainstreams economic, environmental, and social dimensions.

How can integration and coherence be strengthened across the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF), its priorities and outcomes? What “glue” can bring the different results groups together in a common endeavour?

Representatives of ILO, UNDP, UNDRR, UNECE, UNEP, UNESCO and UNICEF have kindly offered their time to deliver this webinar within the framework of the Coalition. The webinar will be recorded and made available to other UNCTs.

The IBC was established in March 2020. It comprises 17 members from the UN family: FAO, ILO, IOM, OHCHR, UN Habitat, UN Women, UNDP, UNDRR, UNECE, UNEP, UNESCO, UNFCCC, UNICEF, UNOPS, WFP, WHO and WMO.
